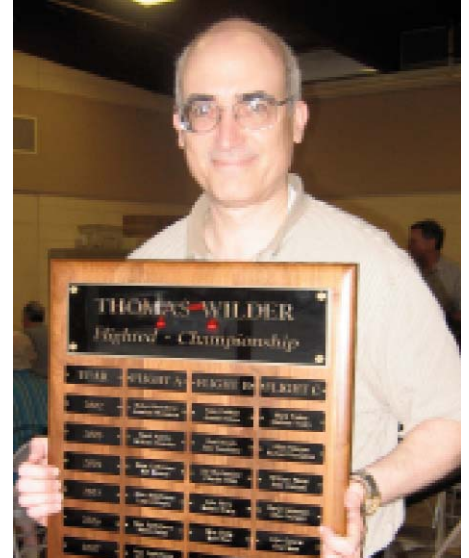

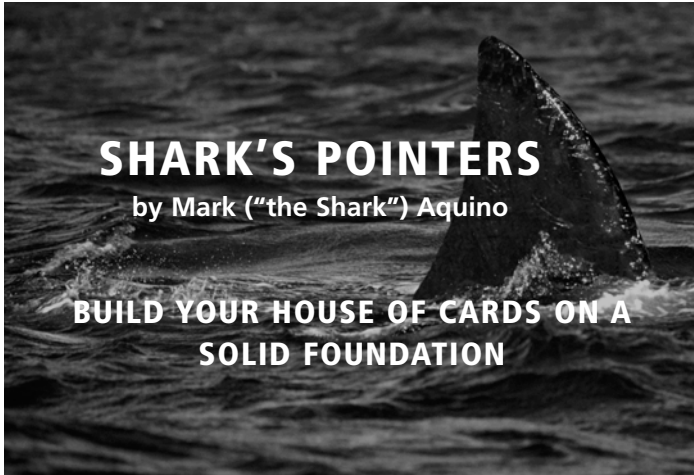
PUT YOUR GAME TO THE TEST

Thomas Wilder Flighted Championship, Saturday, August 9, determines the top players in EMBA Flights A, B and C

EMBA's August tournament is unique. The Saturday pairs event is flighted—players compete only against pairs within their own bracket. Flight A is an open event. To qualify for Flight B, you must have no more than 2000 master points and no more than 750 master points for Flight C.

The Thomas Wilder Flighted Championship commemorates a man whose contributions to EMBA were significant. Anyone who knew Tom Wilder will recall a quiet, smart man who worked hours behind the scenes to keep EMBA tournaments running flawlessly. Those who knew him best say that he would have been pleased to be remembered with an event that recognizes the achievements of players at every level of the game. Wilder was a PhD metallurgist as well as an investment counselor specializing in the metals markets. Within EMBA, Wilder contributed his time as EMBA tournament chairman. In 2001, he chaired the NAP qualifier tournament. At the time of his death, in 2002, he was acting vice president of EMBA.

Don't miss this opportunity to play against your peers—and to earn a permanent spot in EMBA history. The names of the winners of each flight are engraved on the Thomas Wilder Flighted Championship trophy, which will be on display throughout the August tournament. ♣



The hand featured on the right was played recently in a regular club game at the Bridge Spot in Woburn. South was the declarer after an aggressive—and optimistic — auction got the pair to six spades. The hand is interesting because it illustrates how to win at bridge by applying some basic and recurring principles.

1 Count winners and losers before playing to trick one. Declarer could see that there is at least one trump loser, unless the King and Jack of spades are doubleton and onside. That gives declarer five spade tricks. In addition, there are two club winners, three diamonds and one heart, for a total of only 11 tricks. However, there are definite possibilities for developing a 12th trick. If the heart finesse is on, declarer would have two heart tricks. Or, if the club Queen and Jack drop, the club 10 could be the 12th trick.

2 Delay a key decision as long as possible.

If the heart is on, this hand should be easy. But declarer would risk the entire contract by taking the heart finesse too early. So when the club Queen was led, declarer trumped in his hand to keep his options open—and took the spade finesse at trick two.

3 Refine your plan as you gain information.

When the spade King popped out of West's hand, declarer presumed that trumps were splitting 4-1. Now declarer cannot avoid a spade loser, so hearts need to break 3-2 with the King onside. An extra club trick won't help because declarer started with four hearts. He can pitch two, but will still have to contend with the other two. The finesse is the only viable option.

4 Visualize the required end position and manage both plays and entries carefully to achieve it.

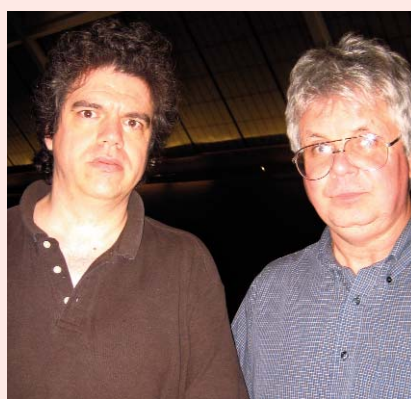
In order to lose only one trump trick, declarer has to do some fancy work. The cards are in the right hand. But because declarer doesn't have another spade to lead to the 10 and 6, the play must be managed in such a way that East's last two cards are the Jack and 9 of trump—and only one is a winner. Declarer must execute what in bridge jargon is called a "trump coup." Can he do it? Yes he can! But it requires thinking ahead. He must shorten his trump so that they are the same length as East's. He must also set up a winning heart in dummy. That means declarer must find the King of hearts on side—which it is. Let's follow the play from trick three:

(Remember declarer trumped the Queen of clubs lead in hand at trick one and led a spade to dummy at trick two.) At trick three, declarer plays the Queen of trump, confirming the 4-1 split. The Ace and King of clubs are played, taking two hearts from declarer's hand. Now, the Queen of hearts is played. (Assume that East does not cover—it matters not.) A small heart is then played to the Ace. Declarer returns to the dummy with a high diamond and trumps a heart. With four cards left (see box, page 3), declarer plays back to the dummy to the diamond King and East has to follow. When declarer plays the heart Jack, East is stuck. No matter what he does, he only wins one trick with his Jack-nine of trump. The trump coup has worked. Declarer's 12th trick is scored *en passant* as East is helpless.

5 When it takes a specific lie of the cards to make your contract, assume that the cards are exactly where you need them to be. Even if that seems foreign, it's the only approach that makes sense—if you think about it. On this hand, declarer did just that and scored up the slam.

Today's Shark's Pointer: Build your game on a solid foundation of basic principles. Practice and apply them wherever you can. Soon, you will become a consistent winner. ♣

and experience the cuisine of America's oldest Italian neighborhoods. It's a walking tour that is like a cooking class on foot. The two-hour tour costs \$25.

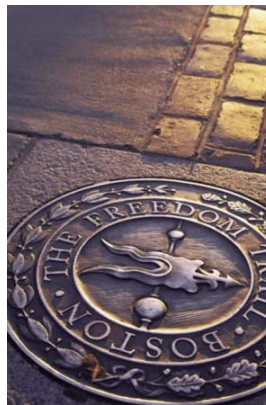


John F. Kennedy Library

The two hour and 15 minute trolley tours cover over 100 points of interest, including a 30-minute stop at the USS Constitution.

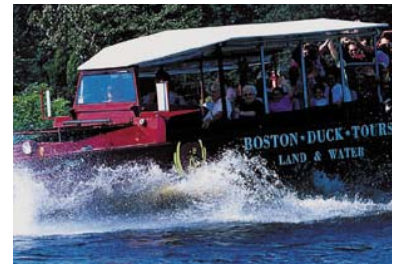

The top three pairs in Flights A, B and C will qualify to play in the national NAP competition at the Spring 2009 NABC in Houston. Cash awards are paid to the top two pairs to help offset travel and lodging expenses. The more times you play, the better your chance to qualify for this prestigious event.

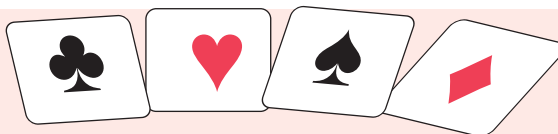
Puritan annual barbecue
